The south and west portions of town would be serviced by pressure sewers, with its mainline following the beachline into the disposal plant. The disposal plant could be built on one half acre of ground, but with future expansion in mind, and if condemnation is necessary to obtain a plant site, one acre should be purchased originally. The discharge, just the clear water would be piped to the center of the harbor. The solids must be removed in a tank truck. The sale of solids for fertilizer was discussed, and the council was advised that it was not a money making proposition. The phant could be operated for \$3400.00 dollars per year, to include labor and supplies. Costs estimated were; mainline and disposal plant \$217,000.00; extension of mainlines to include all city limits, \$46,000. Methods of financing through General Obligation Bonds, front foot assessments and service charge were discussed.

Fawcett:

Val Fawcett was called upon to give any ideas he might have on financing. He stated that he must go over everything with the engineers first to establish sound costs. He spoke against a general obligation bond. He suggested the re-financing of the water system, and combining it with the sewer system to cut down yearly costs, and to extend the payment period to its greatest length. He asked that the council enter into an agreement with his company, McLean and Co. giving them the right to investigate the financing, and guaranteeing them permission to sell the bonds, if and when the system might become a reality. Upon a motion by Councilman Uddenberg and seconded by Stanich, McLean and Company were given the rights handle the financial end of the sewer plan, and the right to issue and sell the bonds. The cognicil is not subject to pay any retainer to McLean and company under this agreement. Val Fawcett will contact H. Harstad and report back to the council his findings.

Howard T. Harstad agreed in behalf of his company that a schedule would be established to satisfy the government claims if they were demanded at anytime. Mr. Harstad will report back to the council with further plans and estamates regarding the proposed system. The meeting brought out many questions that must be answered before the proposed system can be presented to the people of the town.
