## **RESOLUTION NO. 550**

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF GIG HARBOR. WASHINGTON, AUTHORIZING THE PIERCE COUNTY EXECUTIVE TO EXECUTE AN INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT AMENDING THE INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WHICH CREATED THE PIERCE COUNTY REGIONAL COUNCIL (PIERCE COUNTY REGIONAL COUNCIL RESOLUTIONS R92-140 AND R-95-139S).

WHEREAS, In 1992, the Cities and Towns of Pierce County, and Pierce County, entered into an interlocal agreement (ILA) creating the Pierce County Regional Council (Pierce County Council Resolution No. R92-140); and

WHEREAS, In 1995, the Cities and Towns of Pierce County, and Pierce County, entered into an interlocal agreement (ILA) amending the interlocal agreement (Pierce County Council Resolution No. R95-139S);

WHEREAS, The Pierce County Regional Council serves as a multi-government forum for coordination of growth management issues, reviews and makes recommendations for funding certain transportation projects, and provides an opportunity for building consensus on issues common to the Cities and Towns and the County; and


WHEREAS, Chapter 39.34 RCW (the Interlocal Cooperation Act) authorizes jurisdictions to enter into interlocal agreement; and

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Article VII of the existing ILA, the Executive Committee of the Pierce County Regional Council has approved a series of amendments to the Interlocal Agreement and, in order for the amendments to become effective, it is necessary for the Cities and Towns and the County to execute a new interlocal agreement amending the original ILA; NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of Gig Harbor:

Section 1. The Mayor is hereby authorized to execute the Interlocal Agreement (ILA) (as shown in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference), which amends the Interlocal Agreement creating the Pierce County Regional Council.

Section 2. The amended ILA will become effective when approved by sixty percent of the member jurisdictions representing seventy-five percent of the total population of the County. The amended ILA shall be filed with the Washington State

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6	This agreement is entered into by and among the cities and towns of
7	Pierce County and Pierce County. This agreement is made pursuant to
8	provisions of the Interlocal Cooperation Act of 1967, Chapter 39.334
9	RCW. This agreement has been authorized by the legislative body of
10	each jurisdiction pursuant to formal action and evidenced by execution
11	of the signature page of this agreement.
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13	I. NAME:
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15	THE NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION WILL BE THE PIERCE COUNTY REGIONAL
16	COUNCIL
17	
18	II. MISSION:
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20	The Pierce County Regional Council is created to promote
21	intergovernmental cooperation on issues of broad concern, and to
22	assure coordination, consistency, and compliance in the
23	implementation of State law covering growth management,
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comprehensive planning, and transportation planning by county 1 government and the cities and towns within Pierce County. It is 2 the successor agency to the Growth Management Steering Committee 3 and serves as the formal, multi-government link to the Puget 4 Sound Regional Council. 5 6 III. CREATION: 7 8 This agreement shall become effective when sixty percent (60%) of 9 the cities, towns and county government representing seventy-five 10 percent (75%) of the population within Pierce County become 11 signatories to the agreement. The agreement may be terminated by 12 vote of two or more legislative bodies collectively representing 13 sixty percent (60%) of the population within Pierce County. 14 15 IV. MEMBERSHIP AND REPRESENTATION: 16 17 Membership is available to all cities and towns within Α. 18 Pierce County and Pierce County. 19 20 Associate membership is available to such nonmunicipal ₿. 21 governments as transit agencies, tribes, federal agencies, 22 state agencies, port authorities, school districts and other 23 Exhibit "A" 24 Page 2 of 13, Resolution No.

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special purpose districts as may be interested. Associate members are non-voting.

C. The General Assembly of the organization shall be comprised of all elected officials from the legislative authorities and the chief elected executive official of the member cities, towns and county government. Associate members and staff from the various jurisdictions shall be encouraged to participate in General Assembly meetings, but without a vote.

D. The Executive Committee of the organization Connect shall be 12 comprised of representatives from member jurisdictions as 13 follows: four (4) representatives from Pierce County 14 including the County Executive and three members of the 15 County Council; three (3) representatives from the City of 16 Tacoma; and one (1) representative from each of the 17 remaining jurisdictions. Each representative shall have one 18 vote. 19

E. One representative from the Puyallup Tribal Council, one
 representative from the Port of Tacoma Commission, one
 representative from Pierce Transit, and one representative
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of WSDOT District 3 will be ex officio, non-voting members of the Executive Committee Connect. At its discretion, the Executive Committee Connect may create additional ex officio, non-voting positions from among other Associate members.

Voting members of the Executive Committee Collign shall be F. 7 elected officials and shall be appointed by the local 8 jurisdictions they represent. Alternate representatives to 9 the Executive Committee Concine may be designated who are 10 elected officials and are of the same number as the 11 authorized membership for each jurisdiction or group of 12 jurisdictions. Other elected officials and staff from the 13 various jurisdictions shall be encouraged to participate in 14 Executive Committee Contend discussions, but without a vote. 15

17 V. GENERAL ORGANIZATION:

A. Structure

1. The organization shall consist of a General Assembly,

constitute a quorum. Except as specified in the bylaws, actions voted upon shall be approved by a simple majority vote of the quorum. The by-laws shall provide for special voting processes and the circumstances when such processes are to be used.

The president and vice president chains of the Executive Committee council shall serve as president
 and vice president from of the General Assembly.

 The General Assembly shall adopt an annual work program.

4. The General Assembly meetings shall be conducted in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (RCW 42.30).

18 VI. FUNCTIONS AND AUTHORITY:

A. The Pierce County Regional Council will:

Promote intergovernmental coordination within Pierce
 County.

13	4.	Develop consensus among jurisdictions regarding review

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19	б.	Develop recommendations, as required, for distribution
20		of certain federal, state and regional funds.
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22	7.	Provide educational forums on regional issues.

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5	9.	Serve as the successor organization to the Growth
6		Management Steering Committee which developed the
7		county-wide planning policies, and complete such tasks
8		as may have been begun by the Steering Committee,

- f. review and make a recommendation to Pierce County on the respective location of Urban Growth Area boundaries;
- g. make a recommendation to Pierce County regarding dissolution of the Boundary Review Board;
- monitor development, including population and employment growth; and
- i. provide advice and consultation on population disaggregation.
- B. The organization shall adopt by-laws to govern its proceedings. By-laws shall be adopted by the Executive Committee and shall be in effect unless contrary action is taken by the General Assembly.

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1	C. Nothing in this agreement shall restrict the
2	governmental authority of any of the individual
3	members.
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5	VII. AMENDMENTS:
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7	Amendments to this agreement may be proposed by any member of the
8	General Assembly and shall be adopted by affirmative resolution
9	of the Executive Committee Sources and of the individual

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14	VIII. SERVERABILITY:
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16	If any of the provisions of this agreement are held illegal,
17	invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain

2	and each city/town clerk, the Secretary of State, and the
3	Washington State Department of Community Development.
