### **REGULAR GIG HARBOR CITY COUNCIL MEETING OF AUGUST 24, 1998**

**PRESENT:** Councilmembers Ekberg, Young, Owel, Dick, Picinich, Markovich and Mayor Wilbert.

CALL TO ORDER: 7:04 p.m.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Update on Plans for the new Tacoma Art Museum.

Mayor Wilbert introduced Connie Bacon, Port Commission and Member of the Board of Trustees for the Tacoma Art Museum. Ms. Bacon gave an overview of the efforts to build a new Art Museum utilizing public and private funds. She explained that the County was going to issue a challenge in an attempt to raise \$300,000 from the surrounding cities and towns, and asked for the City of Gig Harbor to consider participation. She introduced John Lantz, another member of the Board of Trustee from the Museum. Mr. Lantz gave a brief overview of the education efforts of the museum reaching all ages. This presentation will be followed up by a written proposal.

- **MOTION:** Move to approve the remaining items on the consent agenda. Young/Ekberg – unanimously approved.

### OLD BUSINESS:

1. <u>Third Reading and Reintroduction of Ordinance – Amending GHMC Criminal Code</u> <u>Section.</u> Carol Morris reintroduced this ordinance to adopt the state criminal code. She answered questions and explained that Council had the option to adopt this at this reading per ordinance 1.08.020 (B).

MOTION: Move to adopt Ordinance No. 801. Picinich/Owel – unanimously approved.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

 Legal Service Agreement. Mark Hoppen, City Administrator, presented this contract to continue legal services with Carol Morris, who is resigning from Ogden Murphy & Wallace effective August 31, 1998. He recommended continued employment of Ms. Morris through a separate contract that nearly mirrors the contract with Ogden Murphy & Wallace.

Councilmember Dick recommended tabling this item until later in the meeting to be able to discuss the contract during Executive Session. Carol Morris explained that the terms of the contract could not be discussed during Executive Session, only her performance. She and Mr. Hoppen answered Councilmembers' questions on coordination of representation, and assured Council that they would not have to pay two retainers for the month of September. After discussion on corrections to the language in the contract, the following motion was made.

- MOTION: Move to approve the attached legal services agreement contract between the City of Gig Harbor and Carol Morris with the changes on page 1, paragraph 2, Term, to fill in date of September 1, 1998; page 2, paragraph B, Section 5 is deleted; page 3, number 4(A) Compensation, to read "services commencing September 1, 1998"; page 4(D) Reimbursable Costs, last line, to read "Section 3(A)(2)." Ekberg/Young – unanimously approved.
- 2. <u>Street Pavement Marking Contract Award</u>. Wes Hill, Public Works Director, presented this recommendation to award the contract to apply pavement markings to the city's arterial streets to the lowest bidder.
  - MOTION: Move to the contract to Apply-a-Line, Inc., in the amount of sixteenthousand one-hundred thirty-seven dollars and twenty-five cents (\$16,137.25). Picinich/Owel – unanimously approved.

### **<u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>**:

<u>Jack Bujacich – 3607 Ross Avenue</u>. Mr. Bujacich asked questions about the Consent Agenda. Mr. Hoppen explained that what is on the agenda is listed, Council is given the background information on the items, and that any Councilmember could remove an item before approving the agenda.

### COUNCIL COMMENTS:

Councilmember Young explained that he attended the Pierce County meeting, and that the Lakewood Annexation/UGA issue had passed by a narrow margin, even though he had voted against the measure. He added that they had also approved overlapping UGAs for the City of Fircrest and University Place.

Mayor Wilbert invited Councilmembers to the reception for the Mayor of Takuma, Japan, to be held on September 9<sup>th</sup>, at Murphy's Landing beginning at 6:00 p.m.

### STAFF REPORT:

<u>Public Works Department.</u> Wes Hill said he was pleased to announce that the Skateboard Park had been ranked number 10 on a list of approximately 78 projects. He said that funding was not absolutely assured, but it was looked promising.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION:** Mark Hoppen explained that there was no need to adjourn to Executive Session.

- WHEREAS The fire service in Gig Harbor is dedicated to the safety of life and property from the devastating effects of fire; and
- WHEREAS The members of the fire service are joined by other concerned citizens of Gig Harbor, as well as businesses, schools, service clubs and other organizations in their fire safety efforts; and

### INTRODUCTION/BACKGROUND

Attached is an ordinance which updates the City's Subdivision Code. During the last update in 1996, a section on "certificates" was omitted. The updated ordinance reinstates this section.

### POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The proposed revisions reflect minor changes to Title 16. The proposed changes are consistent with RCW 58.17 (State Subdivision Code) and are internally consistent with other chapters of Title 16.

### FISCAL CONSIDERATIONS

The adoption of this ordinance would not have a direct fiscal impact on the city.

### RECOMMENDATION

This is the first reading of the ordinance. Staff recommends adoption of the revised code at the second and final reading of the ordinance.

### ORDINANCE \_\_\_\_\_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE GIG HARBOR CITY COUNCIL RELATING TO SUBDIVISIONS OF LAND; ESTABLISHING CERTIFICATES, FORMS AND SIGNATURES OF APPROVAL FOR INSERTION OF SHORT SUBDIVISIONS AND FINAL PLATS, AND MAKING MINOR CLEAN-UP AMENDMENTS TO THE CITY'S SUBDIVISION CODE; AMENDING SECTIONS 16.04.003, 16.06.005 AND 16.07.003 OF THE GIG HARBOR MUNICIPAL CODE.

WHEREAS, Title 16 was updated in 1996 as part of the City's Development Regulations update under the Growth Management Act and the regulatory reform act of 1995; and,

WHEREAS, the requirements for providing statements of approval on short plats and final subdivision plats from city officials was omitted from the updated Title 16; and,

WHEREAS, this ordinance reinstates those provisions previously omitted from the updated Title 16 by restoring statements of approval forms for short plats and subdivisions; and,

WHEREAS, minor house keeping changes are included for consistency with Title 17, GHMC

## THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GIG HARBOR, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1.Section 16.04.003 of the Gig Harbor Municipal Code is hereby amended asfollows:16.04.003Criteria for approval.Approval of Short Plats

A. Criteria for Approval. The director shall approve the short subdivision and short plat after making make a determination:

<u>1.</u>A. Whether the application complies with Chapter 16.08 GHMC, General requirements for subdivision approval;

<u>2.</u> B-If appropriate provisions are made for, but not limited to, the public health, safety and general welfare, for open spaces, drainage ways, streets or roads, alleys, other public ways, transit stops, potable water supplies, sanitary wastes, parks and recreation, playgrounds, schools and school grounds, and shall consider all other relevant facts, including sidewalks and other planning features that assure safe walking conditions for students who walk to and from school; and

3.-C. Whether the public interest will be served by the short subdivision and dedication.

B. Director's Decision. If the application conforms to all of the above criteria, the Director shall approve or conditionally approve the short plat.

B. Any short plat application submitted to the City for approval shall contain the following certificates. The property owner and the land surveyor shall execute their respective certificates prior to the Director's final decision. The certificates to be executed by City and County officials and employees shall be executed after plat approval, if granted.

1) Mayor – A signature block and statement for the approval of the short plat.

2) City Clerk - A signature block and statement that the City Clerk finds that there are no delinquent assessments outstanding on the property subject to this short subdivision approval.

<u>3) City Engineer – A signature block and statement that the short plat complies with the applicable provisions of the City of Gig Harbor Public Works Construction Standards.</u>
 <u>4) Short Plat Administrator – A signature block and statement that the short plat complies with the City's Development Regulations under Title 16 and 17 of the Gig Harbor Municipal Code.</u>

Section 2. Section 16.06.005 of the Gig Harbor Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

16.06.005 Criteria for approval. A final plat application shall be approved if the subdivision proposed for approval:

<u>1.</u> A. Meets all general requirements for plat approval as set forth in Chapter 16.08 GHMC, General requirements for subdivision approval;

2. B. Conforms to all terms of the preliminary plat approval; and

3. C. Meets the requirements of Chapter 58.17 RCW, other applicable state laws, this title and any other applicable city ordinances which were in effect at the time of preliminary plat approval.

4. Director's Decision. If the application conforms to all of the above criteria, the Director shall approve or conditionally approve the short plat. Any subdivision submitted to the City for approval shall contain the following certificates. The property owner and the land surveyor shall execute their respective certificates prior to the Director's final decision. The certificates to be executed by City and County officials and employees shall be executed after final plat approval, if granted.

A) Mayor - A signature block and statement for the approval of the final plat.
 B) City Clerk - A signature block and statement that the City Clerk finds that there are no delinquent assessments outstanding on the property subject to this final plat approval.

<u>C)</u> City Engineer – A signature block and statement that the short plat complies with the applicable provisions of the City of Gig Harbor Public Works Construction Standards.

D) Planning Director – A signature block and statement that the subdivision complies with the City's Development Regulations under Title 16 and 17 of the Gig Harbor Municipal Code.

 $\underline{6}$ . D. The city council shall make written findings of fact relating to its decision on the final plat, and if approved, shall suitably inscribe and execute its written approval on the face of the plat.

Section 3. Section 16.07.003 of the Gig Harbor Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

16.07.03 Requirements for a complete plat alteration.

A. Application Contents. In addition to the requirements for a complete application as set forth in GHMC 19.02.002, an applicant for a plat alteration shall submit the following:

\* \* \*

3. A copy of the approved plat sought to be <del>vacated</del> <u>altered</u>, together with all plat amendments recorded

<u>Section 4.</u> <u>Severability.</u> If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

<u>Section 5.</u> <u>Effective Date.</u> This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force five (5) days after publication of an approved summary consisting of the title.

### INFORMATION/BACKGROUND

It has been two years since the appointment of the current Design Review Board members. The City Code specifies a two-year term limit, with staggered terms. It has been recommended by Steve Osguthorpe, Planning Associate, to reappoint the existing Board members. With their consent to reappoint, two would be appointed for a one year term, and three to a two year term. Steve has also asked Council to amend the existing code to establish the terms for a longer period of four or six years, consistent with the Planning Commission terms.

All members have indicated that they have an interest in serving again.
